# NOTICE OF MEETING TO VOTE ON TAX RATE

A tax rate of \$ 0.0814 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of  
CO WIDE SCHOOL.

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2024 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for CO WIDE SCHOOL from the same properties in both the 2023 tax year and the 2024 tax year.

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that CO WIDE SCHOOL may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.
